














# Senior Infant -TripAdvisor review of Ms. Barry Virtual Tour Travels

and hopped on some rides including a water slide:



Afterwards, we took a little rest before heading off on our own to the Seattle Aquarium.







Emma-Jane made a zoo habitat.




Lilia created a home for a giraffe family.






Dylan drew a koala family!

On the final day, there was the option of taking a trip to the Kennedy Space Centre, the Georgia Aquarium or to experience the Ocean Dive 360 and dive with dolphins, seals, turtles and sharks. Certainly plenty to keep everyone entertained!!!

### **Fourth Class Virtual School Tour**

Fourth class went on a Virtual School Tour to Whipsnade Zoo in Dunstable just north of London. On their Virtual tour of the Zoo they saw a baby Przewalski foal, a wild boar minding her five new piglets and the yak family who are all named after characters in the Harry Potter movies. They saw a new baby sloth who was taken care of by the zoo keeper. The baby was bottle fed goat's milk every three hours. The Keeper was trying to introduce the sloth to solid food. She has letting him nibble on pieces of carrot. She had to make sure that he did a bit of climbing every day so that he would be ready to join the rest of the sloths in their enclosure. They saw the troop of cheeky squirrel monkeys and we also saw the ring-tailed lemurs, who only live naturally in Madagascar, being given treats of flowers to eat. Lastly we watched zoo keeper Tara getting the otters to show off their running, swimming and diving skills.














### **Sixth Class Virtual School Tour**

On Wednesday 17th June, 6th Class all joined a video call and went on a virtual school tour together. There are so many brilliant tours online, so we went on a trip around the world, you could say! We started off with a guided tour of some of the US National Parks. We then visited some of the UNESCO World Heritage sites and Wonders of

the World on Google Earth, including The Taj Mahal, The Great Sphinx of Giza, Stonehenge, Machu Picchu and The Great Wall of China. After that, we looked at some of the animal's live cams in the San Diego Zoo, Houston Zoo, Monterey Bay Aquarium and Georgia Aquarium. We then briefly explored the White House and The Vatican before finishing our tour in Disneyland and trying some virtual roller coasters. Some of the websites were a bit slow to load (as can happen with technology!) so the class had the option of exploring them in more detail by using the tour links sent on Seesaw, as well as some new tours that were a bit too long to explore on video call, such as Ellis Island, NASA & Auschwitz.
