Thank you to all of the staff members and paretns who helped to screw on the bottle tops and also to Ms. Richards' father, Les Richards, who cut the wood to size and mounted the mural on the wall.

The design is in 3 parts representing our local area and the linkage to the sea going from the right with our nearby mountains, the Parish church, an inclusive and happy rainbow connecting to our school, the river around the school leading to the sea with a warm and caring sun and a lighthouse watching out and showing the way (as well as being the name of one of our favourite assembly songs- My Lighthouse!).














Creative Schools



There is no reason for any concern about this as all schools are in the same situation this year and staying off school was the right thing to do if relating to Covid!

catching. Then we moved on to batting with fielders and bowling. This was a lot of fun trying to hit the stumps!



Italian lessons

As part of the Post Primary Languages Ireland Programme Mr. Salvo Cacciato (a parent in the school) gave Italian lessons to 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th classes. All of the pupils really enjoyed it and we are so grateful to Salvo for giving up so much time to enthuse our pupils about Italian and other languages! Salvo is a post primary teacher on secondment to the PPLI so big congratulation to Salvo on the development of an extremely successful initiative!

At the start of February, we started to do Italian lessons. Our teacher Salvo would knock quietly

and then he would say "Ciao, buongiorno!" very loudly. At the start of doing Italian lessons, Salvo gave us Language Passports. First, we had to write the languages we spoke in the boxes and pick a colour for them, then we had to colour a person in with the languages we spoke. After, we learned the basis of Italian like how to say hi, bye etc. We also learned the feelings like happy, sleepy, exited and more. If we answered the question right we would get a prize which would be a pen or a badge or a keyring. Also we had to say, my name is_____. We played a game as well where Salvo would take an Italian word off the whiteboard and we would have to guess what was that he took away. Then we had to guess the top Italian names from the top twenty girls or boy's names and we got stickers to write our Italian names. Also every week he would bring Giorgo the ginger teddy cat who had a blue Italian jersey on, and one week he forget Giorgo! On the last lesson we made traditional Italian food out of materials around the classroom and there was a photographer to take photos of us. After he took a video of us explaining our amazing foods. 
